



Alternative minuscule forms, flourished. Experiment with these forms, seeing in your layout process where a tail or swash might add a decorative element to your design. Keep in mind that flourishes work best at the beginning or end of a sentence. And always, if you can't flourish, don't prove it. Keep your letters simple and well constructed.
